Introduction

Established in 2006, the Global Land Tool Network is a growing coalition of more than 75 international partners concerned with rural and urban land issues, working together to contribute to poverty reduction and sustainable development through promoting secure land and property rights for all, demonstrated through country-level interventions. The Network builds on a shared understanding that delivering land rights to the poor requires a development of pro-poor land tools at scale within the framework of the continuum of land rights approach. Access to land and secure tenure is a key requisite to alleviate poverty, food security and promote sustainable development in developing countries. In many developing countries only 30 percent of land is registered; less than 2 percent of this land is held by women. Existing land initiatives tend to deliver land to middle and high income groups, rather than the poor. Where land initiatives have targeted the poor, the scale has generally been too small to meet demands.
