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PRIndex aims to rapidly and cost-effectively contribute to the creation of a global data set about security of property rights with an emphasis on citizens' perceptions of tenure security, and use these data as evidence to drive policy reforms that expand secure rights for all during the 2030 SDG Agenda.


The PRIndex initiative seeks to contribute to a more prosperous, secure and sustainable world by enabling all citizens to obtain secure property rights. The purpose of the PRIndex study is to measure perceptions of individual property rights and self-reported status of property documentation in support the global effort to monitor land rights.

The likelihood of success of PRIndex as a global data set depends on participation of local and international stakeholders. The Prindex team is committed to this principle of direct engagement of statutory institutions, legislative bodies responsible for generating and reporting on national and international data on Land and Property right in each selected country, civil societies and research institutions.

Country consultation and stakeholder engagement can be any communication about the Prindex Initiative that takes place between the selected country and one or more stakeholders. To be part of a consultative process, however, such communications should be part of an ongoing, two-way dialogue that is strategically planned, organized, and implemented for the purpose of designing, generating and disseminating information about PRindex. Country Engagement and stakeholder consultations is an opportunity to improve each stage in the Prindex development process,

PRindex engagement strategy requires a timely, participatory and meaningful process of consultations with key stakeholders who seeks to contribute to a more prosperous, secure and sustainable world by enabling all citizens to obtain secure property rights. This requirement ensures accountability and ownership the contributes to improve the design and strengthens relationships between each selected country and key stakeholders who are essential to the success of PRIndex implementation and greater utilization of results and findings.

### **PRIndex Country Regional and Consultation and Stakeholder Engagement Process**



This goal of Prindex Country consultation and stakeholder engagement strategy is to enable the team to engage with selected countries and other stakeholders on the Prindex process a timely, transparent and meaningful way in order to disclose and disseminate information about the PRIndex Initiative. The engagement process will ensure that stakeholders are fully aware of opportunities and benefit of Prindex as a data sources to measure perceptions of individual property rights and self-reported status of property documentation in support of the global effort to monitor land rights.

#### **Country and Regional Consultation and Stakeholder Engagement Process:**

Through consultations of these types, each selected country can establish constructive relationships with a variety of external stakeholders and maintain those relationships over time. The active engagement of stakeholders increases their sense of ownership and commitment to key decisions and outcomes leading up to the agreement and implementation of a compact program.

#### **Planning and capturing public consultations and stakeholder engagement**

The nature and frequency of country and stakeholder engagement may vary depending on the legislature nature and demand of stakeholders and policy makers in the selected country.

The Land Ministries in selected countries are the main point of contact in the country consultation and engagement. Consultation with the land Ministries and relevant Land agencies should be done at each stage of Prindex roll-out and results dissemination.
